LCCHS UNIFORM

All students are expected to be in full uniform at all times.



Uniform includes grey pant/skorts, white or blue LCCHS tops, a crewneck sweater, and entirely black shoes. Please refer to your agenda.

Non uniform shoes and athletic wear may be worn in Phys Ed. For hygiene purposes, it is your responsibility to be prepared and look presentable at school. It is a matter of pride!



THE LCCHS UNIFORM

Please be advised that if you arrive at school without your uniform, your parents will be called, and you will be sent home.

SHOES

Shoes must be entirely black.



During the winter months, you must change into your school shoes upon arrival and store your boots in your lockers.

SKIRT LENGTH

Only the skort with integrated shorts are permitted. No rolling of skorts is permitted.

HEADWEAR

Headbands must be PLAIN (either blue or black). No hats or hoods may be worn indoors.

Cellphones, Headphones, and Earbuds

- Cell phone/headphone/earbud use are NOT permitted during class time
- Staff members will confiscate phones taken out during class time or between classes
- Urgent calls are not an excuse. Urgent calls to and from home are to be carried out at the office
- Confiscated cell phones and earbuds will be kept at the office for the rest of the day.
- BE RESPONSIBLE! While in class and in the hallways, the rule is:

"ON SILENT AND OUT OF SIGHT!"



If your cellphone or earbuds are confiscated, you will need to serve an afterschool detention.





HALL PASS (Agenda)

Students asking to leave the classroom for the purpose of washroom use or getting water must have an agenda. It acts as your hall pass.

 Leaving the classroom is at your teacher's discretion and should be avoided.



EATING IN THE SCHOOL
