Jean Augustine

- Jean Augustine made history as the first Black woman elected to Canada's Parliament, serving from 1993 to 2006.
- Her roles included Parliamentary
 Secretary to the Prime Minister, Minister
 for Multiculturalism and the Status of
 Women, Chair of the Foreign Affairs
 Committee, and Deputy Speaker.





Jean Augustine

- She brought the motion to recognize February as Black History Month to the House of Commons in 1995
- From 2007 to 2015, she was Ontario's first-ever Fairness Commissioner.
- In 2008, the Jean Augustine Chair in Education, Community & Diaspora was launched at York University to help advance education, equity and inclusiveness.



MYP Approaches to Learning Tip of the Day: Critical Thinking

Challenge Assumptions: When faced with a problem or new information, take a moment to identify and question the assumptions behind it. Ask yourself, "What am I assuming here?" and "Are these assumptions valid?" This practice helps you uncover hidden biases and leads to more thorough and objective analysis.

By regularly challenging assumptions, you'll sharpen your critical thinking skills and make more reasoned and balanced decisions. Keep questioning and exploring

ATL skills focus:

- 1. Research Skills: Essential for conducting experiments, gathering data, and analyzing results. This includes information literacy, media literacy, and ethical use of information.
- 2. Thinking Skills: Critical for problem-solving, analyzing data, and developing hypotheses. This includes critical-thinking, creative-thinking, and transfer skills.
- 3. Communication Skills: Important for presenting findings, writing lab reports, and collaborating with peers. This includes effective interaction, reading, writing, and using language to communicate information.
- 4. Self-Management Skills: Necessary for planning and executing experiments, managing time, and maintaining focus. This includes organization, affective skills, and reflection.
- 5. Collaboration Skills: Vital for working in teams, sharing responsibilities, and supporting peers during group projects. This includes working effectively with others and practicing empathy

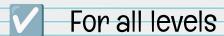

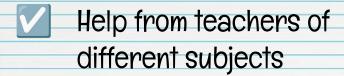
