For the students who will be watching the play in the auditorium today, please keep the following rules in mind:


- You are watching a play not a movie, the actors can hear you if you are talking.



Skill Focus: Research

Paraphrase and Summarize: Instead of copying text, paraphrase or summarize the information in your own words. Even when paraphrasing, always provide a citation to the original source. **This also applies to the use Al technology.**

Properly Attribute Images and Media: Always provide proper attribution for images, videos, and other media. Include the creator's name, title, source, and license. Use tools Is like Google Images' usage rights filter to find images that are free to use.

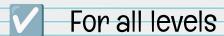


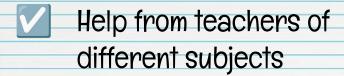
