



Skill Focus: Research

Paraphrase and Summarize: Instead of copying text, paraphrase or summarize the information in your own words. Even when paraphrasing, always provide a citation to the original source. **This also applies to the use Al technology.**

Properly Attribute Images and Media: Always provide proper attribution for images, videos, and other media. Include the creator's name, title, source, and license. Use tools Is like Google Images' usage rights filter to find images that are free to use.

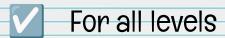


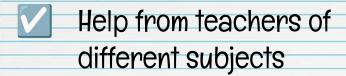



The repertoire will depend on the taste of the players—all styles welcome!









Line extension



The 61 Wellington is being extended to LaSalle!

- The route extension will take place on March 24th (Monday)
- The 61 will serve LCCHS at the old 58 bus stop (Centrale / Bishop-Power)
- The extension will primarily follow the old 58 route
- The new route will terminate at Gagne / George (Near Couche-Tard)

Routes 38 and 114 will also receive minor adjustments on March 24th.
