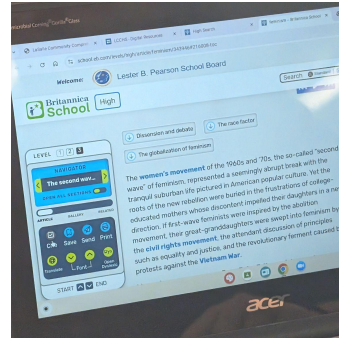
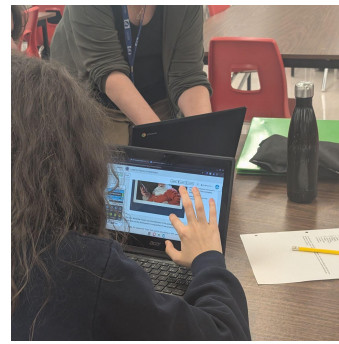
The Outsiders - Pre-reading Research Assignment

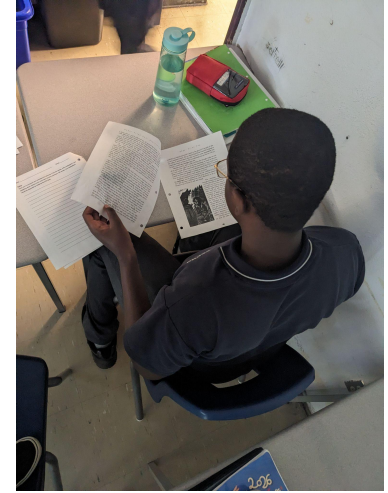
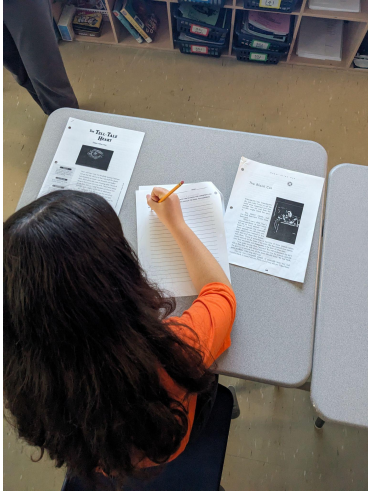
Part A:

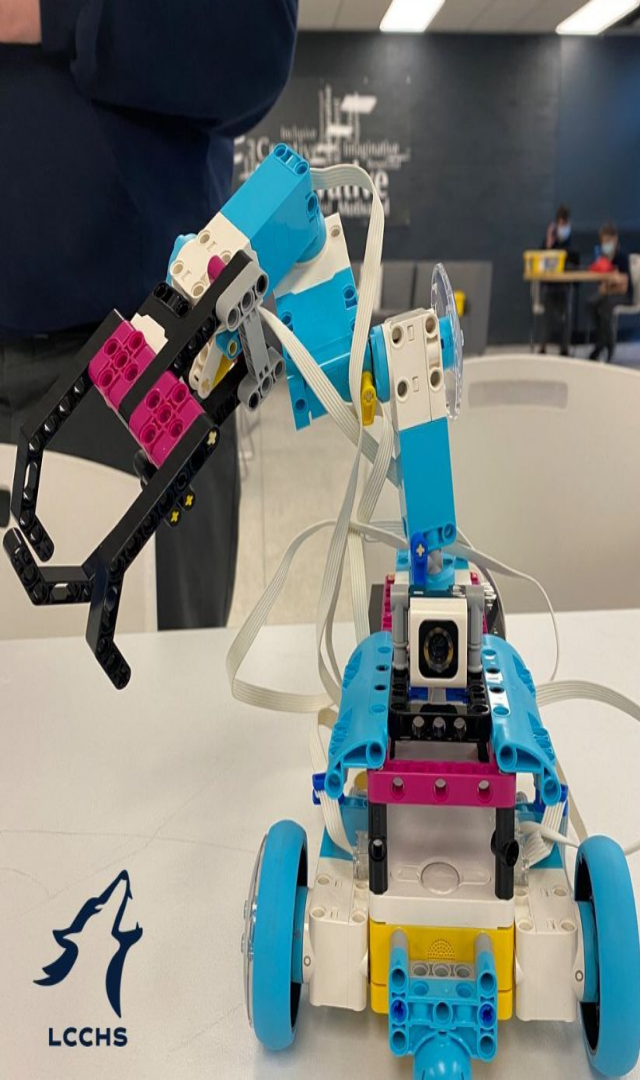
