# i. Approvals -field trips

#### i. Principal

 PISA Program for international student assessment. Assessment to measure the skills and knowledge of 15 yr olds from across Canada and around the world. 49 students

- randomly selected from Sec. 3-4. Assessment will take place May 14th. The Government of Canada does this study every 3 years. Ministry of education.
- As mentioned last year. We brought up that the skirt is being removed from the school uniform. We were looking for an alternative with our supplier. We are looking at pants tailored for girls, we have had complaints that the current pants are not comfortable for girls. Offering also a short for girls, a little shorter than the bermuda. A message will be sent to parents about the alternative options and try ons will be at the end of May.
- Battle of the books, a few weeks ago we hosted the Regionals. Between Lakeside, Beurling, LCCHS. We came in 1st and went to finals. We came in second at the finals. PCHS took first place. Ms. Mitchell is so proud of everyone involved, Ms. Shyngera, Ms. Hughes, librarian Molly. We have always made it to the school board finals.
- Saturday school, May 3rd to June 7th (except Victoria weekend). We offer tutorials in History, Math CST and Science. Snacks will be provided. In person from 9am-12pm with one short break. Hoping students take advantage of the extra help.
- Déboulage Sec 3, students must pass classes before passing to the next level. We received funding to have extra help for the students. We secured a recently graduated student teacher, they will help the teacher, or take students out to help them, etc. That will start after the Easter holiday and keep them on through the exams.
- Summer renovation project: work has been approved for early June, dismantling and installation of the gas boiler. Toilets will be renovated. Aug. 2025, replacement of electrical and gas boiler. Hopefully it will all be done by the time students come back. Summer 2026, replacement of main electrical entrance.
