On Friday, March 20<sup>th</sup>, LCCHS celebrated its annual Multicultural Food Fiesta. On this day, students brought in a variety of cultural food samples, dressed in cultural garb and celebrated the diversity of our school. This project was led by the Sec. 2 IB students under the leadership of Mme Baillargeon.



#### **Energy Unit - Secondary 2**

Over the next three weeks, the Sec. 2 IB students will be studying a unit on Energy, which will include the following global contexts: Scientific and Technical Innovation and Globalization and Sustainability. This unit will be an interdisciplinary unit alongside Mr. Fournier's Géographie unit, which also relates to energy. According to the IB, "the Middle Years Programme (MYP) interdisciplinary learning supports students to understand bodies of knowledge from two or more disciplines or subject groups, in order to integrate them and create new understanding. Students demonstrate interdisciplinary understanding when they bring together concepts, methods, or forms of communication from two or more disciplines or established areas of expertise so that they can explain a phenomenon, solve a problem, create a product, or raise a new question in ways that would have been unlikely through a single discipline."

#### **Design - IB Secondary 5**

The IB Sec. 5 students have just wrapped up their unit "Learning a new skill can help you to become familiarized with yourself".

Students used the DESIGN CYCLE to learn a new skill (of their choice):

- Inquire & Analyze
- Developing Ideas
- Creating the Solution
- Evaluating the Goal

Some students taught themselves how to play the guitar, knit, bake, sing, play chess, master the Rubik's Cube, paint on canvas, hone stress management skills, and so much more!





#### **IB Music**

IB students have been discussing and researching how music benefits humans. They have discovered that singing and playing an instrument exercises all major parts of the brain, forming connections that will strengthen their thinking. Students are reflecting on how music benefits them holistically; how it can change their mood, inspire their emotions, be used to communicate messages between people and throughout society, and also sharing which types of music are most important in their lives.

## French Theatre - Secondary 4 & 5

In connection to their unit on THEATRE, the Sec. 4 & 5 students went to see a play called "Le barbier de Séville", a comedy based on the criticisms between social classes.

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#### Language A - Secondary 5

The Sec. 5 IB students, with Mr. Thivierge, are studying Macbeth, learning to write Literary Essays for CEGEP and will hopefully have time to produce some scenes!

#### **IB Art - Secondary I**

After learning about the need to protect endangered species, the Sec. I IB students are demonstrating their acquired awareness through their latest project: Animal Stamps.

In this unit, students were inspired by famous painter Andy Warhol's series on endangered species in the 1980s. Each student is responsible for creating an animal stamp of his/her choice. Using paint and oil pastels, students will create vividly colourful images of their animal on black paper, demonstrating the rich beauty of their animal. Upon completion, the assembled images will raise awareness regarding the need to protect many species on our planet.
